A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



As I reflect on the year 2023 was for Empower House, I cannot be more proud. We all know that transition is sometimes difficult, and we experienced a huge leadership transition here at the start of the year. And even with that, our staff have remained attentive to community, consistent in our work, and responsive to needs as they arise. Our Community Health Program continued to support women and their families through innovative services and evidenced-based programming. Through our Empower Women events and workshops, we offered everything from mammograms to conversations on sustainable living. Through Empower Parents programming, we partnered with three local school districts to support families in building life-giving relationships both between adults and between caregivers and children. We offered community building circles and healing circles for individuals looking to engage restorative justice practices. And Community Health Workers supported community members with education, systems navigation, direct aid and other wellness supports. Our Empower Youth program offered daily afterschool programming, inschool programs, Spring Break, and Summer Camp.

And our radio aired thought-provoking, relevant, and engaging local content.

2023 also offered us exciting opportunities to grow in response to community. In March, we hired a radio producer, paving the way for expanded radio programming. We also launched our Mental Health programming – providing youth and their families access to both supportive and clinical mental health supports. With support from United Way Dual Gen Initiative, we launched Effective Black Parenting Program (EBPP), an innovative program that promotes family pride and cohesion while confronting the realities of racism. We also piloted Mobility Mentoring in Community Health and Empower Youth programs, equipping staff with evidence-based tools to better support individuals in setting and achieving goals they set for themselves. Finally, this fall, we added an additional Restorative Justice Specialist to our team -- so Empower House is now in three SAISD schools! And we ended the year with the exciting news that our application for 24/7 programming on 101.5 FM was approved. So listeners can now tune in over the air or online any time of day. What a year! Thanks so much for your support! We can't wait to see what 2024 will bring!





DEMOGRAPHICS OF PARTICIPANTS


***** RACE / ETHNICITY




***** GENDER

Improved Individual Well-Being

In 2023, our Community Health Program worked to address health challenges and break down barriers to care. By enhancing access to crucial services like Empower Parents programming, Empower Connects workshops, Community Circles, Mobility Mentoring, Empower Women and Empower Communities Workshops and events, we played a pivotal role in fostering transformative change across our communities. Direct assistance in 2023 amounted to \$105,214.76, reflecting our ongoing commitment to building healthier, stronger communities.

PARENTING





* TRIPLE-P: POSITIVE PARENTING PROGRAM

Total served through Triple P

194

Triple P is an evidenced-based parenting program curriculum that has contributed to stronger families worldwide. It offers strategies that strengthen parent-child relationships. With multiple levels of support, it caters to diverse family needs. In 2023 Empower Parents served 194 caregivers with Triple P.

Level 3 Caregivers Served

19

This level offers targeted counseling for caregivers of children facing mild to moderate parenting challenges through two-hour small group sessions focusing on specific situations like disobedience, aggression, bedtime routines, and hasslefree shopping. Sessions are flexible, allowing stand-alone participation or series commitment, enhancing accessibility and support for parents. In 2023, 19 caregivers participated in discussion groups.

Level 2 Caregivers Served

52

This level's 'light touch' approach empowered 52 caregivers, providing one-time seminars for parents who are generally coping well, but have one or two concerns with their child's behavior or development. Seminar themes: Power of Positive Parenting; Raising Confident, Competent Children and Raising Resilient Children.

Level 4 Caregivers Served

133

Through our goup classes, participants gain skills to address challenging behaviors, as well as practice tuning in to their children's needs, learning their cues, and understanding better how to meet those needs. Caregivers engage in five sessions, supplemented by three phone counseling sessions, reinforcing practiced parenting strategies. 133 caregivers benefited from this program.

* PARTNERS IN PEACE

In 2023, Partners in Peace classes empowered 78 parents with invaluable strategies and insights that strengthened positive relationships between caregivers and kids. Additionally, participants gained crucial awareness regarding signs of unhealthy adult relationships and their impacts of on children. Feedback from participants highlighted their appreciation for the safe and nurturing environment they created together with our educators, who facilitated meaningful discussions and empowered openness among participants to share and support each other.

* EFFECTIVE BLACK PARENTING

Parents Served

5

Launched in 2023, the Effective Black Parenting Program (EBPP) completed 5 participants. EBPP aims to promote family pride and cohesion as well as help families confront the negative impacts of racism. Through tailored strategies and dedicated support, caregivers built a learning community that empowered them in their parenting journey. They expressed profound appreciation for the invaluable guidance they found in their facilitator and one another.

COMMUNITY CIRCLES

Circles serve a vital role for collective empowerment, dialogue, and collaboration as we embody our commitment to building strong and inclusive communities together. Within our programs, circles provide opportunities for participants (youth and adults) to explore new ideas, understand themselves, reflect, learn, and heal in the context of community. In 2023, we facilitated a total of 100 circles engaging 344 participants, with 62 specifically tailored for youth, involving 152 youth participants, and 38 designed for community engagement, welcoming 194 community participants.

EMPOWER WOMEN & EMPOWER COMMUNITIES

Empower Women and Empower Communities are transformative programs dedicated to fostering personal growth and community empowerment. Through a series of skill-building and wellness workshops, we equip participants with the knowledge, skills, and support network necessary to make informed choices for themselves and their families. By providing a nurturing environment and valuable resources, we empower participants to navigate life's challenges with confidence and resilience.

Empower Women

In 2023, Empower Women hosted 11 events, serving 202 women with transformative workshops and community support. Through these gatherings, women were empowered to pursue their goals with confidence, exemplifying the program's commitment to fostering positive change.

Empower Communities

130 served through

7 events

In 2023, Empower Communities hosted 7 events, serving 130 community members with essential resources and support. These gatherings strengthened community bonds and cultivated positive change, demonstrating the program's commitment to building resilient and inclusive communities.

DIGITAL EQUITY

In 2023, Empower Connects continued its mission of bridging the digital divide by offering essential digital equity opportunities. Through access to the internet, devices, and tailored digital skills workshops, our program empowers community members with the knowledge and confidence to navigate technology effectively. This year, we reached a milestone with 29 participants engaging in our workshops, hosting 7 impactful digital equity workshops focused on topics such as job searching skills and digital literacy. Additionally, our community computer lab served 124 individuals, providing them with resources to access online educational materials, apply for jobs, and connect with loved ones. These efforts are instrumental in fostering greater digital inclusion and empowerment within our community...

EMPOWER YOUTH



The Empower Youth program provides a supportive environment where youth can explore their world, achieve their dreams, and inspire their peers. During the school year, we offer daily afterschool programming 5 days per week at Lockwood Park where youth have access to daily enrichment activities, mental health support, academic tutoring, mentoring, skills building and more. We also provide Restorative Justice (RJ) support at SAISD schools through staffing RJ Specialists on three partner campuses. Additionally we offer Spring Break and Summer camps.

In 2023, Empower Youth witnessed significant achievements as 124 youth enrolled in the program and set ambitious goals for themselves. Among them, 47 youth achieved their set objectives. Additionally, our tutoring initiative provided essential support, with 76 students benefiting from 1,697 services in Math and Reading, highlighting our commitment to empowering the youth we serve to achieve and thrive!

MENTAL HEALTH



Our mental health program plays a vital role in supporting youth aged 12-19 and their caregivers through accessible mental health services. This program, provided at absolutely no cost to individuals, offers counseling services where individual, group, and family counseling are available through telehealth and in-person services. In 2023, we supported 34 individuals with a total of 202 counseling sessions, underscoring our commitment to addressing the mental health needs of our community members.

EMPOWER HOUSE RADIO 101.5 FM - KXEP



In 2023, The Empower House Radio built partnerships and conducted interviews with community leaders, advocates, artists, and storytellers, resulting in over 40 original shows covering diverse topics like culture, social justice, mental health advocacy, and city policies. Collaborations with local content creators expanded our reach with access to over 300 originally produced shows. Our initiatives, including monthly Open Mic Nights, workshops with organizations like Form Communities, and storytelling workshops with the Latino Collection and Resource Center, have empowered community and elevated local stories. Our radio staff is relatively small (2 people), but with collaboration across the organization, with the support of program staff like Irene White, Laura Rhodes, Elda Olvera, and Kelly Hernandez-Kubala, we were able accomplish so much more than we imagined. Our biggest success was FCC approval of our application to air 24 hours/day, 7 days/ week on 101.5 FM! So you can now tune in anytime!
